

PREVIEW MEN'S SUPER TEAM LARGE HILL – Saturday 11 Feb 2023

Super Team Event

- This will be the inaugural men's Super Team event in World Cup history.
- Earlier this season, the first women's Super Team event took place in Zao. Eva Pinkelnig and Chiara Kreuzer won for Austria.

Austria

- Austria won the only men's World Cup team event that has been held this season. On 14 January, Stefan Kraft, Manuel Fettner, Michael Hayböck and Daniel Tschofenig won in Zakopane ahead of Poland and Germany.
- Austria has won a record 36 men's team events in the World Cup, leading Norway (27) in second place.
- Since the start of the 2020/21 season, Austria has won six of the 10 men's team events (large hill/ski flying). Slovenia (2), Germany (1) and Norway (1) won the other four events. Austria also won gold in the men's team event at the Olympic Winter Games in Beijing in 2022.
- Only Gregor Schlierenzauer (35) recorded as many podium finishes in men's team events in the World Cup as Stefan Kraft (31).

Other contenders

- **Germany** is the reigning world champion in the men's large hill team event. On 6 March 2021, they won in Oberstdorf ahead of Austria and Poland.
- **Slovenia** won the most recent world title in a men's team event. On 13 March 2022, they won the men's ski flying team event in Vikersund.
- Peter Prevc was part of 29 of the 32 Slovenian teams that finished on the podium of a men's team event in the World Cup.
- Norway's Johann André Forfang and Daniel-André Tande (both 12) share fourth place alongside Peter Prevc (12) on the all-time list for most men's World Cup team wins. Austria's Gregor Schlierenzauer (17), Thomas Morgenstern (16) and Andreas Kofler (15) make up the top three.
- **Poland** has won seven men's team events in the World Cup, but not since a win in Klingenthal on 14 December 2019.
- Kamil Stoch and Dawid Kubacki have been part of all seven Poland wins in World Cup team events. Piotr Zyla won six team events.
- **Japan** won the last men's World Cup team event that was held in United States, in Salt Lake City on 19 January 2001. That victory is still Japan's most recent win in a men's team event in the World Cup.
